POLICY

Roles of the non-voting members of the Board.

PURPOSE

To outline the duties and roles of the non-voting members of the Board.

Registrar

- is an employee of the Board who supervises and controls all registration procedures
- supplies each of the Division Reps with a copy of all registration slips for their division.
- takes payments and receives registration forms at walk in registration
- · works closely with the Treasurer to ensure all funds are collected and accounted for
- makes suitable arrangements for the handling and safe keeping of cash at all times and for its deposit in the bank
- receives monies and signs cheques for payment of authorized accounts and presents same to treasurer for co signature
- prepares and presents to the board by December 15th of each year, a complete list of members who are in arrears in order to have said players removed from the ice by December 15th.
- keep a register of all players registered in TAMHA
- co-ordinate all phases of player registration
- maintain Hockey Canada online database of players and teams
- determines in conjunction with the president and treasurer, the pro-rata refund of any member who must withdraw during the season.
- reports to the board at monthly meetings
- · assigns and pays timers for TAMHA games

Development Coordinator

- responsible for the overall direction of the TAMHA's development program
- main liaison with coaches for all skill development activities
- main liaison with Hockey Nova Scotia's Development personnel
- is responsible for registering Association Coaches for appropriate training courses as mandated by HNS.

- responsible for outlining the budgetary requirements for the overall development program
- provide the leadership within the Association to achieve the program objectives
- prepare a weekend schedule of the yearly HNS development weekend
- reports to the board at monthly meetings
